



Revelation 5:1-10

The Rise of the King

1) Jesus alone has the right & authority to reclaim His creation

(5:1-5)

A) The Lion: Jesus is the King who was promised to rule all nations. (Rev. 5:5, Genesis 49:9–10)

B) The Root: Jesus is God who was behind the promise the whole time. (Rev. 5:5, 2 Sam. 7:16, Luke 1:32–33, Rev. 22:16, Luke 20:42-44)

C) The Conqueror: Creation's redemption was bought and paid for by the blood of the Lamb (Rev. 5:5, 5:9-10)

2) The cross and the scroll are the two most important moments in history. (Rev. 5:7, Eph. 1:7-10)

A) Jesus secured our personal redemption (Eph. 1:7)

B) Jesus will secure global redemption (Eph. 1:8-10)

3) When we really understand the worthiness of Jesus, He becomes the center of our affection and worship. (5:8-10)

A) By His death He has won all right and authority (Rev. 5:9, Col. 2:15)

B) He succeeded in redeeming a people for God (Rev. 5:9, Romans 12:1–10, 1 Peter 2:9-10)

C) He is about to succeed in redeeming God's world (Rev. 5:10, 19:11–14, 20:4-6)
